District 1

“District 1 makes the luxury goods that decorate and beautify our great Capitol. It’s excellent taste and craftsmanship keep Capitol residents bewigged and bedazzled year-round.”

–A statement from Octavius Deniumont, Capitol Resident

Currently, District 1 has a population of **24,315**, making it the **9th largest district** in Panem .

District 1 sits above the northern border of the Capitol, where the American states **Montana, Idaho, Utah, and Wyoming** used to be.

It is bordered by **District 4** to the **west**, **District 7** to the **north**, and **District 5** to the **south**.

District 1 has a tesserae rate of **0.069 tesserae per person** and a **tesserae percentage of 6.96%**.

District 1’s traditional color is **citadel green**, with a color code of #88844. This color is believed to represent the olive branch that District 1 offers from the districts to the Capitol.

District 2

“Our nation would be nothing without District 2's superb stonework, weaponry, and peacekeeping training facilities. District 2 build, fortifies, and protects our cities and its citizens are known individually for their strength.”

–statement from Maximillian Everglow, Capitol Resident

Currently, District 2 has a population of **231,354**, making it the **2nd largest district** in Panem.

District 2 lies to the south of the Capitol, over where ruins the American states **Colorado and New Mexico** are. This district features the beautiful Rocky Mountains.

It is bordered by **District 8** to the **east**, **District 10** to the **south**, and **District 5** to the **west**.

District 2 has a tesserae rate of **0.008 tesserae per person** and a **tesserae percentage of 0.873%**.

District 2’s traditional color is **red oxide**, with a color code of #5a2520. This color represents the strength of its citizens and the blood that their tributes spill annually in the Hunger Games.

District 3

“Panem is one of the most advanced nations in mankind’s history, thanks to the efforts of District 3. Its computers keep us all connected and it’s electronic gadgets keep us all entertained.”

Currently, District 3 has a population of **195,329**, making it the **3rd largest district** in Panem.

District 3 lies behind the eastern border of the Capitol, where the American states **Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, and Minnesota**.

It is bordered by **District 12** to the **east**, **District 8** to the **south**, **District 9** to the **west**, and **District 6** to the **north**.

District 3 has a tesserae rate of **0.322 tesserae per person** and a tesserae percentage of **32.27%**.

District 3’s traditional color is **palomino beige**, with a color code of **#ba7e48**. It symbolizes efficiency, practicality, stability, intellect, and innovation, reflecting their technological expertise and contributions to the Capitol's advancements.

District 4

“Do you like seafood? Shrimp and crabmeat? Often overlooked, District 4 plays an essential role, bringing us the bounty of the sea. These citizens are adept with nets and tridents, and can swim like fish themselves.”

Currently, District 4 has a population of **111,453**, making it the **7th largest district** in Panem.

District 4 is situated on the western coast of Panem, encompassing the past territories of **California, Oregon, Nevada, and Washington**.

It is bordered by **District 7** to the **north**, **District 1** to the **east**, and **District 5** to the **southeast**.

District 4 has a tesserae rate of **0.236 tesserae per person** and a tesserae percentage of **23.67%**.

District 4’s traditional color is **plantation teal**, with a color code of **#415149**, being known to symbolize the seas and lakes which District 4 provides for the Capitol from.

District 5

“Electric, solar, and nuclear– District 5 harnesses the energy of the earth and the sky in order to power our great nation.”

Currently, District 5 has a population of 134,345, making it the **5th largest district** in Panem.

District 5 lies in the remains of American states **Arizona, Utah, Nevada, and New Mexico**.

It is bordered by **District 4** to the **northeast**, **District 1** to the **north**, **District 2** to the **east**, and **District 10** to the **southeast**.

District 5 has a tesserae rate of **0.021 per person** and a tesserae percentage of **2.14%**.

District 5’s traditional color is **ripe eggplant**, with a color code of #492d35. This reflects the district’s role in power generation, and representing the stability and efficiency it provides the Capitol with.

District 6

“Our hovercraft, our high-speed trains, and our cargo trains come to us from District 6. Ironically, the citizens here have little love for travel.”

Currently, District 6 has a population of **784,453**, making it the **largest district in Panem**.

District 6 lies in the old territories of **Ontario**, a territory that was owned by the Canadian government in addition to the American states **Michigan, Wisconsin, Illinois, Minnesota, and Ohio**.

District 6 is bordered by **District 3** to the **south**, **District 9** to the **northwest**, and **District 10** to the **east**.

District 6 has a tesserae rate of **0.087 tesserae per person** and a tesserae percentage of **8.71%**.

District 6’s traditional color is **crushed leaves orange**, with a color code of #a15431. It represents the district’s transportation industry and the warmth, energy, and vitality it brings to the Capitol.

District 7

“This beautiful district is lush with trees, from which these citizens supply our lumber and paper. The people of District 8 are hardworking and down-to-earth.”

Currently, District 7 has a population of **26,354**, making it the **8th largest** district in Panem.

District 7 lies in the remains of mostly old Canada, **Alberta, British Columbia, Saskatchewan**, alongside the American states **Montana, Washington, Idaho, and North Dakota**.

District 7 is surrounded by **District 4** to the **southeast**, **District 1** to the **south**, and **District 9** to the **east**.

District 7 has a tesserae rate of **2.395 per person** and a tesserae percentage of **239.58%**, suggesting individuals often take out **multiple tesserae for themselves**. The Capitol praises District 7 and its residents for using the Capitol's gifts wisely, and building support for the annual games!

District 7's traditional color is **pine-bark brown**, with a color code of **#7c5242**. This shade is known to represent the lumber that District 7 provides to be spread amongst the Capitol structures.

District 8

“From the simple, lovely fabrics of the districts to the brocades favored in the Capitol, District 8 sews, spins, and dyes it all.”

Currently, District 8 has a population of **122,134**, making it the **6th largest district** in Panem.

District 8 is part of the territory in the American states **Illinois, Kansas, Missouri, Tennessee, Arkansas, and Kentucky**.

District 8 is bordered by **District 12** to the **east**, **District 11** to the **south**, **District 2** to the **west**, **District 9** to the **northwest**, and **District 3** to the **north**.

District 8 has a tesserae rate of **0.572 tesserae per person** and a tesserae percentage of **57.26%**.

District 8's traditional color is **buff leather brown**, with a color code of **#835c27**. This color symbolizes the naturalness in the origins of both

District 8's fabrics and dyes.

District 9

"District 9 is Panem's bread bowl, giving us the fertile harvest we need to keep rising as a nation. Its amber waves of grain are an inspiration to us all.

Currently, District 9 has a population **15,346**, making it the **11th largest district** in Panem.

District 9 is in the areas where American states **Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota**, as well as the Canadian province **Manitoba**.

District 9 is surrounded by **District 6** to the **northeast**, **District 3** to the **east**, **District 8** to the **southeast**, **District 2** to the **southwest**, **District 1** to the **west**, and **District 7** to the **northwest**,

District 9 has a tesserae rate of **4.593 tesserae per person** and a tessera percentage of **459.3%**. This informs us that District 9 is one of the most prominent investors in tesserae across Panem! The Capitol thanks you for supporting the games and carefully using their generous offers.

District 9's traditional color is **log cabin green**, with a color code of **#373b2c**. This hue represents the wild nature that District 9 takes and transforms into the grain and flour that feeds the Capitol.

District 10

"The gentle lowing of cattle is the first thing a visitor to District 10 hears. This region raises strong, healthy livestock, which becomes the meat that helps us raise strong, healthy children of Panem."

Currently, District 10 has a population of **19, 234** making it the **10th largest district** in Panem.

District 10 mostly lands in the area of what used to be Mexico, in the areas of **Aguascalientes, Chihuahua, Coahuila, Durango, Nuevo León, San Luis Potosí**, and **Tamaulipas**, also in the remains of the American state of **Texas**.

District 10 is bordered by only three other districts: **District 11** to the **northeast**, **District 2** to the **north**, and **District 5** to the northwest.

District 10 has a tesserae rate of **15.179 tesserae per person** and a tesserae percentage of **1517.9%**. The Capitol sincerely thanks District 10 for being the second most purchaser of tesserae. Citizens of District 10, you are hard working and know how well your Capitol treats you and you use our unsparing gifts to once again support us.

District 10's traditional color is **donkey grey**, with a code of **#7d6f67**,

representing a common color palette on both its skies and strong livestock and coats.

District 11

"Known for its bountiful orchards, District 11's workers spend their days among rustling fruit trees and sizeable farms."

Currently, District 11 has a population of **138,546**, making it the **4th largest district** in Panem.

District 11 is in the old territory of the American states **Oklahoma, Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, and Georgia.**

District 4 is surrounded by **District 12** to the **northeast**, **District 8** to the **north**, **District 10** to the **southwest**, and **District 2** to the **northwest**.

District 11 has a tesserae rate of **5.937 per person** and a tesserae percentage of **593.7%**. The Capitol praises District 10 for being a major purchaser of tesserae across Panem!

District 10's traditional color is **earth brown**, with a code of #36291f, showing both common features in the citizens of District 10 and the earth and soil which they use to provide produce for the Capitol.

District 12

"One of the outer districts, this is nonetheless a crucial one. These brave and hardy workers descend deep into the earth each day to mine the coal that keeps our nation running."

Currently, District 12 has a population of **7,935**, making it the **12th largest district** in Panem.

District 12 is in the past areas of the American states **Kentucky, Ohio, and West Virginia.**

District 10 is surrounded by **District 8** to the **south and southwest**, **District 11** to the **south**, and **District 3** to the **northwest**.

District 12 has a tesserae rate of **1.449 per person** and a tesserae percentage of **144.93%**.

District 12's traditional color is **ebony**, with a code of #000000, representing the darkness of its mines and the beautiful silence in the color of the Capitol's main power source, coal.
