PURPOSE OF MEDICATION**Expected Pharmacological Action**

Replacement or supplementation to endogenous thyroid hormones

Therapeutic Use

- Replacement in hypothyroidism to restore normal hormonal balance
- Suppression of thyroid cancer

Complications

CNS: headache, insomnia, irritability. CV: angina pectoris, arrhythmias, tachycardia GI: abdominal cramps, diarrhea, vomiting

Medication Administration

- 50 mcg as a single dose to start
- May beq q-3 wk by 25 mcg/day; usual dose is 75-125 mcg/day (1.5 mcg/Kg/day)

Contraindications/Precautions

Hypersensitivity, Recent MI, Hyperthyroidism cardiovascular disease (initiate therapy w/lower doses), Severe renal insufficiency, uncorrected adrenocortical disorders

Nursing Interventions

Assess apical pulse /BP prior to & during therapy. Assess for tachyarrhythmias & chest pains

Children monitor: weight, height, psychomotor development

Interactions

Bile acid sequestrants and orlistat absorption of orally administered thyroid preparations.

Client Education

Educate patient that medication will not cure hypothyroidism, therapy is lifelong.

Evaluation of Medication Effectiveness

Levo PO: UNKNOWN 1-3 week

Levo IV: 6-8 hr /24 hr
