

- Nurses apply the concept of prioritization to all types of care decisions across many unique health care settings.
 - Prioritization provides framework for the Nurse to do order of care
 - As nurse prioritizes hypotheses they will be able to build care plan
 - If patient condition changes, nurse reprioritizes plan of care.
- Questions to consider
- Which hypotheses are most important & should be prioritized?
 - What are the risks of ignoring other hypotheses?
- Critical cues
- Chest pain
 - High or low vitals
 - Critical lab results
 - Loss of consciousness
 - Respiratory distress
- } Should be reported
- Some patients need to be deferred
- Threats to patient safety / survival
- Hypotheses vary & change
- Nurse uses clinical judgment
- Nurse collaborates

- Ranking hypotheses
- Urgency → Is it life threatening?
 - Likelihood → Most/least likely to occur
 - Risk → Possibility of further impact
 - Effects on other hypotheses → What impacts what?
