- > next point of information: I don't like to use abbreviations or shorthand symbols if they aren't letters, such as w/, but that's just personal preference. If you're in a rush, they can really help with getting all the info down

- > draw and label all diagrams

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- > I leave a space between sections for easy reading

Formula: $a^2 + b^2 = c^2$ (pythagorean Theorem)

- > I like to box important information, such as formulas, laws, values
 - for important information concerning the class, not the actual concept (such as exam tips/hints). I use a sticky note like this:

- > sometimes, there are diagrams too!

- if I need to know how to draw me diagram on the exam, I will draw it out in my notes
- if I only need to know how to label a diagram, or if I'm only adding it for reference, I print it out.

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- > try to summarize everything in your own words! There's no point in writing notes if it's just another copy of your teachers slides that you could've printed out and saved time
- > Keep your notes pretty simple! This ensures you're focused on the information when studying, rather than on decorating.
 - try to make something aesthetic as possible can also interfere with studying, as you rip out a page with errors, or leave out a diagram if you're afraid of messing up drawing
- > notetaking in general is pretty flexible - there aren't many rules about how long your points can be. Try out different methods and styles to find the best one for you!
