## Era 1: Creation

Creation: man is created in the image of God

Fall: sin entered the world

Flood: judgment for sin

Tower: Beginning of the nations

## Era 2: Patriarch

Abraham: Father of Hebrew people

Isaac: Second father of the promise

Jacob: Father of the nation of Israel

Joseph: Leader in Egypt

## Era 3: Exodus

Deliverance: Freedom from Slavery in Egypt

The Law: God's commandments at Mount Sinai

Kadesh Barnea: Place of rebellion against God

Forty Years of Wandering: Consequences of rebelling against God

## Era 5: Judges

Judges: the leaders of Israel

Rebellion: the breaking of God's law

Cycles: Repetition of Israel's misfortunes

Ruth: A model woman

## Era 7: Exile

Dream: Daniel interprets the King's dream

Daniel: leads them through exile

70 years: Daniel gave them hope for 70 years

Cyprus: lets them rule themselves under their religion

## Era 9: Silence

Pharisees: are interpreting the bible and 10 commandments.

Leagism: the pharisees have them under very strict rules.

Silence: God isn't talking to his people, sending judges, Later Ministry: Growing rejection replacing kings, or saving them from exile.

## Era 11: Church

Ascension: Jesus Ascends to heaven

Peter: has a calling

Church: Peter Starts the Church

## Era 4: Conquest

Jordan: A miraculous parting of water

Jericho: A miraculous conquest of a city

Conquest: The defeat of Canaan

Dominion: Finalizing dominion

## Era 6: Kingdom

David: greatest King in the new monarchy

Unrighteous Kings: David is followed by mostly unrighteous kings

Exile: God sends them into exile to pay for their sins

## Era 8: Return

Main Person: Ezra

Cyprus: Lets them go back to their home to rebuild the temple, but they are under his rule.

Ezra: Leads them back to the promise land.

## Era 10: Gospels

Early Life: Childhood to baptism

Early Ministry: Initial acceptance

Later Ministry: Growing rejection

Death and Resurrection: Final rejection

## Era 12: Missions

Main person: Paul

Location: Roman Empire

Missions: Paul expands the church into the Roman Empire
