2. two plans of government

virginia Plan edward randolph & james madison

- how many branches of government
 - there are three branches of government (executive, legislative, and judicial)
- how was the legislature organized
 - consisted of two houses
 - both houses award seats based on population
- which states did this plan favor
 - favored big/larger states with more population

new-jersey Plan william paterson

- how many branches of government
 - there are three branches of government (like the virginia plan)
- how was the legislature organized
 - consists of one house
 - every state gets one representative
- which states did this plan favor
 - favored smaller states with less population

the great compromise roger sherman

- who created the plan known as the great compromise
 - roger sherman
- according to the great compromise, how are states represented in each house of congress
 - in the house of representatives:
 - seats are awarded based on population
 - favours the states
 - in the senate:
 - each state gets two senators no matter what the population is
 - favours the people
