Only brown, black, and yellow men who had long been made agonizingly self-conscious, under the rigors of colonial rule, of their race and their religion could have felt the need for such a meeting.

There was something extra-political, extra-social, almost extra human about it; it smacked of tidal waves, of natural forces.
